Canyon ISD proudly recognizes outstanding achievement in rigorous academic courses for students attending Canyon and Randall high schools through the Superintendent Scholars program.

QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify as a Superintendent Scholar, a student must:

- Be currently enrolled in the 9th-12th grade in at least four courses listed as a Superintendent Scholar course;
- Earn a semester average of 95 or above in each of the four qualifying courses (including dual credit courses) taken at the high school in one semester or earn an A average in any qualifying course taken at a *college or university or through a college or university correspondence course;
**CISD has established a system to receive Amarillo College dual credit and WTAMU PUP grades. If a student is enrolled in a qualifying course at Amarillo College or another college or university that is not dual credit or PUP, the student is responsible for supplying an official transcript or grade report from the college or university to the district coordinator before April 20. If grade verification has not been received by the district coordinator by this date, recognition and notification as a Superintendent Scholar and inclusion in the printed program is not guaranteed.*
- Averages for second semester will be determined after the fifth six weeks;
- Pre-AP and AP courses will be weighted as outlined in the Canyon ISD Course Bulletin.

Superintendent Scholars will be recognized in the evening on the second Monday in May. There will be a ceremony and reception for the honorees and their parents hosted by the superintendent with the board of trustees as invited guests.
